Admissions

Collège Champittet seeks to enroll students who are enthusiastic and eager to learn. Admission is inclusive, however applicants are reviewed based on their academic record (grades, test scores, and teacher recommendations), character, extracurricular interests and talents.

Collège Champittet offers a diverse palette of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, including courses in Global Citizenship, music, sports, first aid and IT Clubs include a Model United Nations club, a debate club, an Equality, Diversity and Inclusion committee and a Sustainability club. A variety of educational trips are offered, as well as cultural events and a ski camp. Students are actively encouraged to take part in service-learning projects.


Academic Programmes and 2023 Results

We provide a rigorous curriculum rooted in our Swiss standards of excellence. Our three internationally recognized diploma programmes enable students to follow the pathway that best fits their interests and future goals. As a part of Nord Anglia Education, our students benefit from enhanced learning opportunities through the Juilliard Performing Arts programme, our collaboration with UNICEF and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics) programme.

Grading Systems and Class Rank

Starting in the 2023-2024 academic school year, Collège Champittet moved semestrial grade reporting. Quarterly grades are also transmitted to give indications of a student's progress. In years prior, grades were reported once per trimester. Given the diversity of our students' experiences and the variety of programmes offered in our secondary school, our students are not ranked.




Swiss Maturity

The Swiss Maturity Diploma is the official Swiss secondary school leaving certificate, which allows unrestricted admission to all faculties of Swiss universities and the two federal institutes of technology. It is awarded at the end of a rigorous four-year programme which prepares students for undergraduate studies at university. All students are required to take federally administered written and oral exams and to write an Extended Essay of 4000 words. This multi-disciplinary programme provides students with independence, a deep knowledge and understanding of a variety of fields and an ability to analyze critically. To obtain the Maturity Diploma, students must achieve an overall grade of 4/6 (84/126 points).

The highest score of the private schools in French-speaking Switzerland was obtained by a Champittet student.


56% of our students obtained more than 100 / 126 points.



International Baccalaureate

The International Baccalaureate® (IB) Diploma Programmeme (DP) is recognized internationally and respected for its balanced curriculum, which promotes both depth and breadth of learning. In their final two years, IB students follow a rigorous programme composed of 6 courses, with subjects in Mathematics, Sciences, Language & Literature, Language Acquisition, Social Sciences, and an option for Art. All subjects require external exams. Students simultaneously complete core requirements, namely Theory of Knowledge (ToK), Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS), and an Extended Essay (EE). To pass the IBDP, Students must achieve a minimum of 24/42 points, including the completion of the core requirements for which they may earn up to 3 additional points.

The highest score achieved by a Champittet student in 2023 was 43 points.

French Baccalaureate

The French Baccalaureate is internationally recognized, rigorous and adaptable. Students select between three different higher-level options according to their interests, abilities and ambitions. It is an academically demanding degree awarded by the French Ministry of National Education. French Baccalaureate students are evaluated using a combination of ongoing assessment (40%) and final examinations (60%), which are externally evaluated. To pass the Baccalaureate, students must achieve a minimum score of 10 out of 20.



The highest score achieved by a Champittet student in 2023 was 17.4 points.


